Artichoke Breakfast Casserole from Julie Carlson	Hawaiian Banana Bread from Paula Carmichael

California's new Marxist math **By Carole Hornsby Haynes**

Academic courses have become a vehicle for Marxist ideology, using "culturally relevant teaching" demands.

California has approved new radical K-12 math standards that are openly a vehicle for Marxist ideology. The stated goal is equity in math learning for non-whites and those from low-income families. The framework notes that "black, latinx, indigenous, women and poor students" have been "underrepresented in the curriculum throughout history." Equity will be implemented in the curriculum by dumbing down and sugar-coating the lessons and infusing them with political issues and student organizing.

Tom Loveless, education researcher and former Brookings Institute time reviewing the research used by the California framework. He fellow, predicted that the new framework "would place Golden State documented many instances of false or misleading descriptions of 6th graders years behind the rest of the world - and could eventually skew education in the rest of the U.S., too."

The framework boldly states that "teaching toward social justice can Tom Loveless worries that the new math curriculum will influence play an important role in shifting students' perspectives," with reference to Constantinos Xenofontos's 2019 book Equity in Mathematics Education: Addressing a Changing World. The author notes that education for social justice has its roots in Brazilian Marxist education theorist, Paulo Freire. Xenofontos contends that teachers should "discuss controversial topics" and "allow social issues to drive instruction." To teach social justice and equity successfully, teachers must be activists themselves.

Culturally responsive teaching is to be implemented as early as transitional kindergarten — a euphemism for pre-K — "by exploring students' lives and histories and designing and implementing curricula that center contributions that historically marginalized people have made to mathematics." Rather than teach math facts and problem-solving, teachers will conduct gabfests using multicultural children's literature to show examples of what nonwhites have contributed to mathematics. Lessons are to connect math and "environmental and social justice," with students tasked to lessons. Employing math skills, students determine whether trillions write an "opinion piece" or an "explanatory text." The framework notes that math lessons should empower students with tools "to examine inequities."

The Marxist tenet of "oppressor" and "oppressed" is addressed in the framework: "Teachers can begin with awareness that mathematics play a role in the power structures and privileges that exist within our society and can support action and positive change."

Students are to express their emotions and feelings in the "traumainformed pedagogy" that will serve "as part of mathematics sensemaking." The issue of "inclusion" is addressed by students weaving does not bode well for the future of the American economy together six colored cords — "math identity rainbows" — to show classroom community spirit. Vague "big ideas," such as relationships, reign supreme over the normal course progression of arithmetic, Algebra I, geometry, Algebra II, trigonometry,

pre-calculus, and so on. There will be less math facts memorization, and standard algorithms, such as long division, will be downgraded. Student self-discovery will replace explicit direct instruction.

Tom Loveless reviewed the research to determine what is cited or drawn upon and concluded that "the framework ignores the best research on K-12 mathematics." It appears that the research did not support their progressive education biases.

Brian Conrad, professor of mathematics and director of undergraduate studies in math at Stanford University, spent much citations from the literature that was ideology-driven rather than evidence-based conclusions.

other states. Because California is the largest textbook market in the United States, publishers are likely to produce instructional materials to cater to the state's preferences and then sell those to other school districts across the country.

Even before California's new standards, left-leaning publishers were sneaking Marxism into curricula. Fusing political lessons into academic content, the Wit and Wisdom K-5 English language arts curriculum, published by Great Minds, skillfully navigates around state bans on Marxist Critical Race Theory. Age-inappropriate lessons deal with highly charged political issues including segregation, gender fluidity, racism, violence, brutality, slavery, graphic death, suicide, cannibalism, fear, anti-Christian and anti-American sentiment, gore, and pornographic images.

The recently released "Reparations Math and Reparations History" curriculum by the 1619 Project Education Materials Collections fuses Marxist propaganda into math and history of free dollars should be doled out to descendants of enslaved people in the U.S. by white taxpayers.

Once the best educated in the world, the American workforce has become the worst educated in the industrialized world, according to a policy brief by the National Center on Education and the Economy. Our workers are already at a disadvantage in competing with skilled workers of other nations. The new California math curriculum will inevitably impact the math in other states and cause further decline in the academic achievement of our workforce. That

America's military is fast becoming the laughingstock of the world. We can add American education to that. As for crazed states, California is winning the blue ribbon hands down at all levels.

special events, and sadly for teachers and administrators, have been indoctrinating our children in a variety of left-wing ideologies.

The children are given a narrative pushing extreme environmentalism, gender confusion and economic socialism. They learn to hate America, embrace division and are intolerant to opposing views and socialist political activism.

But sometimes, it's private donations to the schools that are not made public that finance this.

These \$10,000 grants promote and support the "Gender Sexuality Alliance (GSA) Clubs.

What they do with this grant money:

- · Create a gender-affirming closet at school
- · Help trans students access clothing that fits their true selves
- Remodel single gender restrooms to "gender neutral"
- · Create LGBT murals on schools
- Produce classroom videos on such things as which pronouns to use.

For example, with Carmel High School in Indiana, the funds are going to be used for a community-wide pride event, which has a

Government-run schools, with their curriculum, their textbooks, their GoFundMe fundraiser to help a transgender student run away from home.

The fundraiser reads as follows: "Hello, we are the CHS Gender Sexuality Alliance, and we are fundraising on behalf of a Carmel High School student who needs to raise money to get out of an abusive household. He cannot fundraise for himself because if his mom caught him trying raise this money himself his situation would get exponentially worse."

This type of indoctrination is possible because school boards, teacher unions and administrators are okay with this politically and morally.

And it would not happen if we had school choice. Why?

Because the subversion of children in public schools would be impossible if parents could leave and put their child in a private school, Christian school or homeschool. Yes, there would be some private schools that would support that. But the only way to stop this madness is through school choice. To break the ideological monopoly is so huge and overwhelming that trying to salvage public schools is an impossible task.

Furthermore, parents need to be aware that when they are spending their money, be careful. The \$10,00 per school is coming from donations from companies like American Eagle. AMERICANISM Submitted by Dian Higginbotham **AMAZING WOMEN in WAR and PEACE**

History raves about the heroics of men in war... but few instances are mentioned in which female courage was displayed. Yet during every conflict, and the peaceful years between, they too were there.

In the beginning of the America we know there was a Revolution. And although the call to arms was for men, Gannett of Sharon and they had three children. During several women donned the uniform of a Revolutionary George Washington's presidency she received a letter soldier and fought against the British. One of these women was:

DEBORAH SAMSON**

In October of 1778 Deborah Samson of Plympton, Massachusetts disguised herself as a young man and presented herself to the American army as a willing volunteer to oppose the common enemy. She enlisted for the whole term of the war as Robert Shirtliffe and served in the company of Captain Nathan Thayer of Medway, Massachusetts,

For three years she served in various duties and was wounded twice - the first time by a sword cut on the side of the head and four months later she was shot through the shoulder. Her sexual identity went undetected until she came down with a brain fever, then prevalent among the soldiers. The attending physician, Dr. Binney, of Philadelphia, discovered her charade, but said nothing. Instead he had her taken to heroine was not in any measure reliable and that his own home where she would receive better care. When her health was restored the doctor met with Robert's commanding officer and subsequently an order was issued for Robert Shirtliffe to carry a letter to her I received from a lady * who knew her personally General Washington. (This may also be "legend" as there is no record of her ever being in Philadelphia.)

When the order came for her to deliver a letter into the Tisdale, upon whom Robert attended in the hands of the Commander-in-chief, she knew that her deception was over. She presented herself at the headquarters of Washington, trembling with dread and uncertainty. General Washington, to spare her embarrassment, said nothing. Instead he sent her with an aide to have some refreshments, then summoned her back. In silence Washington handed Deborah Samson a discharge from the service, a note with some words of advice, and a sum of money sufficient to bear her expenses home. (This, too, may well be more legend than fact.)

After the war Deborah Samson married Benjamin inviting Robert Shirtliffe, or rather Mrs. Gannett, to visit Washington. During her stay at the capital a bill was passed granting her a pension, in addition to certain lands, which she was to receive as an acknowledgment for her services to the country in a military capacity as a Revolutionary Soldier, in part thanks to the efforts of Paul Revere.

**The correct spelling is Samson - inaccurate historians added the letter "P" in later years. There are also several different versions of the story of Deborah Samson, alias Robert Shirtliffe. This one comes from The Women of the American Revolution by Elizabeth F. Ellet, NY, Baker and Scribner, 1848, that's right, eighteen forty eight. In this book Elizabeth Ellet prefaces the story of Deborah Samson with the following:

I have been told that the Female Review about this Deborah Samson repeatedly expressed her displeasure at the representation of herself which she did not at all recognize. The following facts respecting and has often listened with thrilling interest to the animated description given by herself of her exploits and adventures. * A niece of Captain army for some months.

This same accounting appears in *Daughters of America,* by Phebe A. Hanaford, Boston, B.B. Russell, 1882, in which Miss Hanaford refers to Niles, Principles and Acts of the Revolution and to a book called Mrs. Hales Biography of Distinguished Women.

Regardless of which is the authentic version, the fact is that Deborah Samson served her country, in uniform, in the Revolutionary War. Women have done so many unpublicized things that it is time to shed more light on their accomplishments. Did you know that women were torpedoed off the coast of Africa during WWII? Did you know that when Gen MacArthur returned to the Phillipines, Navy nurses were waiting for him on shore and were cut out of the press photos? Did you know that there were women prisoners of war? These pages will continue to light more candles that reflect the deeds and accomplishments of military women...in hopes that future generations will remember that during every conflict **Women Were There !!!**




