Grassroots success stories are like wildflowers breaking through concrete-they're inspiring, resilient and often unexpected. I've recently been listening to Charlie Kirk podcasts, as recommended by my friend Patti Hime. Instead of commentating his opinions he rallies listeners to become engaged in a current hot political topic. This past week he recognized that a simple legislative change in the state of Nebraska could possibly determine the outcome of the Presidential election. Currently Nebraska is one of two states that do not designate 'winner take all' electoral votes, instead it splits them between 3 districts. The college town of Omaha which lies in a liberal district in a red state, typically awards its electoral vote to a Democrat. Changing Nebraska's law to 'winner takes all' allows for a back up plan of tying the electoral votes 269-269 if Trump doesn't succeed in winning Michigan, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania. Thus, throwing the vote to the House of Representatives to break the tie, which we assume Trump would prevail. This seems like a lot of electoral math to insure a 'back up plan' exists but this is not the point of my message.

In real time Charlie Kirk asked his podcast listeners to call the Governor of Nebraska to change the current legislation of splitting electoral votes to 'winner takes all'. Within five hours Governor Pillen publicly endorsed the bill (LB 764) to allow or 'winner takes all'. This was the power of collective action and brings home the point the difference individuals can make when they come together for a common cause.

Unfortunately, the bill was not taken up during the regular legislative session that just ended. However, there is now a push (from concerned citizens) for Governor Pillen to call a special session to get this bill voted in. The work is not yet done and far from completion, but this story offers a beacon of hope showing what's possible when we unite and take action.


The Pursuit of Virtue is the Only Road to Happiness

Jeffrey Rosen, president and CEO of the National Constitutional Center and one of the most respected American constitutional scholars, has written a book which charts a roadmap back to a virtuous nation. Mr. Rosen studied the philosophers, scholars, and religious leaders – Benjamin Franklin, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, George Mason John Quincy Adams, Frederick Douglass, and Abraham Lincoln – who influenced the views of later 18th- and 19th-century Americans.

In Mr. Rosen's new book, *The Pursuit of Happiness: How Classical Writers on Virtue Inspired the Lives of the Founders and Defined America*, he discusses how before and after the Revolution, these Americans sought to emulate virtuous classical figures.

Mr. Rosen begins with Benjamin Franklin's 13 virtues: temperance, silence, order, resolution, frugality, industry, sincerity, justice, moderation, cleanliness, tranquility, chastity and humility. Along with Franklin's 13 virtues are Jefferson's 12 maxims. These founders wrote their virtuous pursuits down, practiced them, and admonished themselves when falling short. Their character and integrity were of the utmost importance. Although the founders often fell short of their own ideals of moral perfection, they took on the quest on a daily basis to become more perfect.

Early American political leaders viewed the purpose of government to be "societal happiness". Happiness stemmed from what we used to know and from what the ancients taught us. It is about virtue. It is about "being good" rather than "feeling good". Mr. Rosen writes "As the silent generation of World War II gave way to the 'me' generation of baby boomers, the hedonism of the 1960's gave way to the narcissism of the 1970's and the materialism of the 1980's. 'You do you' became the new mantra and everyone had an unalienable right to define their own bliss." We have dismissed the origins of our country's concrete and objective "pursuit of happiness" for an abstract and subjective pursuit in both the material and perverse. We have done so at our own peril; and tragically, America has only begun to witness the fruits of that perilous pursuit.


