

Legislative update

Recently signed Bills:

SB1053, an expansion of **SB770** passed in 2014, completely bans single-use plastic bags at grocery stores. If only <u>oceana.org</u> cared about all of the whales, dolphins, and other sea life being killed by offshore wind farms in the Northeast.

"Great news: Governor Newsom just signed <u>SB 1053</u> into law, which means California has banned thick single-use plastic film bags from grocery and convenience store checkouts across the state!" announced Oceana.org in an email Sunday.

IT'S GO TIME!!

Your ballot will arrive this week. Here are some dates to remember:

10/7 San Diego **Registrar of Voters (ROV)** will be open through election day to receive ballots at 5600 Overland Ave. SD 92123 (I recommend this over mailing your ballot and offer to take a few of your friends' and neighbors' ballots for them too!)

10/8 Drop Boxes open (for security reasons, I do not recommend this option!)

10/21 Last day to register to vote without a Provisional Ballot

10/26 In-Person voting begins at the ROV and in select regional locations

11/02-11/4 ALL In-Person voting locations are open 8-5pm

11/5 OFFICIAL ELECTION DAY All ballots must be submitted by mail, drop box, ROV or Polling location (7am 8pm)

11/12 All mailed ballots must be received at the Registrar of Voters

12/17 Election results are sent to Congress to be certified

It's fascinating to watch at the ROV (Registrar of Voters) as the ballots come in and are sorted by area, scanned and sent for signature verification, opened and checked for damage or errors, duplicated if necessary, and sent to Tabulation. **Learn HOW to observe, WHAT to look for, and HOW to respond**. We Lose This Election if You Fail to Act

The race has tightened up just as we expected it to. But the Democrats are going to have a ton of money, and they've got the regime media right behind them. In every community, you have state representatives, congressional representatives and various other local representatives They all need people to run things. Of course, if you haven't already started getting involved, you're probably not going to be doing much at the community level. Nothing says you can't try. We're going to need you again in 2026 when these damn communists once again try to turn our country into a Third World dictatorship like Cuba, Venezuela or Great Britain.

It's the individual level where you shine. This is where you have got to commit personally. There's no substitute for getting out there and doing something. Of course, whether you act or not will probably not determine anything

You're not going to be the one vote that helps Trump win. Hell, if it's that close, they will cheat anyway. But we're talking in aggregate. We're not talking about just you. We're talking about everybody reading this beyond. It's not just about you. It's about talking to other people and getting them to do things to save our country.

You're out there talking to people. You're there on social media. You've got relatives and friends - you're not one of the JD Vance cat women. You've got to spread the word that everybody needs to get a mail-in ballot if that's what you do in your state, and fill it out for the Republicans and send it in quickly.

Marketers will tell you that.





HOW TO "VOTE SAFE" in San Diego County

To avoid excessive handing and processing, delay in counting, technological intrusion and lack of chain of custody, follow the instructions below to vote in person (no envelope):

- 1. When you receive your vote by mail ballot (VBM), open it to be sure there are no errors. Treat it with care and store it where it will remain safe and undamaged.
 - a. Do NOT mix your materials with those of other family members. If emergency requires you to vote with the envelope, the one YOU were sent needs to be the one YOU sign.
- 2. Take your "naked" (no envelope) VBM to the polls on or as close to Election Day as possible. You may fill it out at home or use a booth in the polls to mark it after check-in.
 - a. Mark cleanly and carefully—no cross-outs, erasures, smudges, stains, wet spots. Black or blue ink are equally fine.
 - b. Fully fill in the "bubbles"—no **X** or $\sqrt{}$ or circles. No writing or stray marks.
- 2. Inform poll workers you wish to vote in person.
- 3. Provide your name and address as required by law by filling out the check-in form.
- 4. Take form to clerk at electronic poll book.
- 5. Inform the clerk you will use your VBM ballot.
- 6. Sign the poll pad when requested.
- 7. Put ballot in secrecy sleeve and allow clerk to check sequence number at the top.
- 8. Take you marked ballot in the secrecy sleeve to the ballot box and watch the clerk submit it.
- 9. When you get home, shred the return envelope once you have voted. NOTE:
- Voting early (before polls open) at the ROV is NOT an in-person vote, but simply an in-person VBM vote. You do not avoid the *VBM processing* when you voting that way.
- If poll workers attempt to dissuade you from voting in person, or suggest you are not registered or have already voted, the magic words are: 1) "Please summon your supervisor." 2) "Please call your Poll Worker HOTLINE." Always be polite and patient but stand up for your rights!!
- Provisional ballot and Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) should be LAST resort.
- If a last-minute emergency keeps you from the polls, seal your marked ballot in return envelope, sign carefully and put in mail or allow a trusted friend/relative to drop it off for you at the polls or drop box. If submitted or postmarked by Election Day, it will count.



Perseverance

"The noblest question in the world," observed Benjamin Franklin in *Poor Richard*, "is What good may I do in it?" "Hang in there!" is more than an expression of encouragement to someone experiencing hardship or difficulty; it is sound advice for anyone intent on doing good in the world. Whether by leading or prodding others or improving oneself or contributing in the thick of things to some larger cause, perseverance is often crucial to success.


Drawing on an ancient Chinese proverb, Harry Truman recounted in his *Memoirs* that being president "is like riding a tiger. A man has to keep on riding or be swallowed." He went on to explain that "a President either is constantly on top of event or, if he hesitates, events will soon be on top of him. I never felt that I could let up for a single moment." Perseverance is an essential quality of character in high-level leadership. Much good that might have been achieved in the world is lost through hesitation, faltering, wavering, vacillating, or just not sticking with it.

Like most other virtues, persistence and perseverance cannot operate for good in the world in isolation from practical intelligence. A person who is *merely* persistent may be a carping, pestering, irksome annoyance, having no salutary effect whatsoever. But given the right context, occurring in the right combination with other virtues, perseverance is an essential ingredient in human progress. Sam Adams saw it thus in the gestation period prior to our birth as a nation. "The necessity of the times," he proclaimed in 1771, "more than ever, calls for our utmost circumspection, deliberation, fortitude, and perseverance." And the same holds true today.


