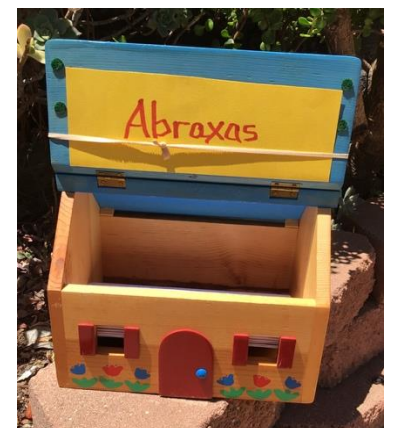

# LEGISLATION

Pamela Candelore | Legislation

## San Diego

There will be no City measures on the November ballot.

The County will have a measure to increase sales taxes by half a cent on the November ballot.

## California

### Taxes and Spending

SB 125 – A new health care tax of \$8.85 per month on private health care to pay for Medical. This amount of this tax can be modified by the State. (75% progression)

SB 417 – 11.25B in bonds for affordable housing, On November ballot

Save Prop 13 Initiative – Protects property taxes. Requires 2/3 vote for new taxes. On November ballot.

Voter ID Initiative – Continues mail-in ballots; however, ballot envelopes must contain last 4 digits of government-issued ID. On November ballot.

Prop 55 Initiative – An extension of 2016 Prop 30. Additional income tax on earners over 700K to pay for Medical and Schools. On November ballot.

Billionaires Tax Initiative – Ostensibly one-time tax on billionaires. But can be amended by State to include any earner and be recurring. On November ballot.

### Election Integrity

SB 73 – Prohibits Law Enforcement from accessing electoral data and machinery. Observers can no longer question the validity of a signature check. (Signed into law but being challenged by Trump Admin)

SB 1164 – Anti-Voter ID - Forbids any election practice which may cause voter suppression to any protected class illegal. Very broad. (50% progression)

AB 1764 – Secretary of State would identify deceased voters using SSA database (died in committee)

AB 1116 – Allows voter registrants to upload the signature that they want the Registrar of Voters to use for verification. New signature would be used in lieu of documented signature. (50% progression)

## Sanctuary State

AB 2669 – Preferential sentencing for illegal immigrants because it could result in deportation. (25% progression)

SB 1194 - Immigration Legal Fellowship Project: free legal advice for immigrants (50% progression)

## Education

SB 998 - Education Equity: discrimination prevention coordinators in schools (50% progression)

ACA 7 – Amends the State constitution to allow discrimination in K-12 education. Would possibly affect admission to gifted and other special programs. Opposed by Asian community. (50% progression. If passed, would be on November ballot.)

## Anti-Transparency

AB 2624 – Nick Shirley Act criminalizes investigative journalism (50% progression)

AB 2903 – Requires Homeless programs to produce reports of expenditures and outcomes including the 24B spent in the last few years on homelessness. (Passed Senate, vetoed by Newsom)

AB 1821 – Charges a fee and extends the time for public records requests. Also allows referrals for criminal prosecution for requests that the State deem to have ‘malicious intent’. (50% progression)

AB 1608 - High Speed Rail Authority Inspector General may conceal information. (50% progression)

## Crime

AB 2108 -Undermines Prop 36. Forces judges to offer non-violent criminals the opportunity to attend a crime diversion program rather than serving time. (50% progression)

## Other

AB 2017 - New State holiday: “Eid” Islamic religious holiday (50% progression)

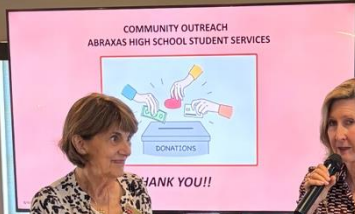
- Knock knock. *Who's there?* Isabel. *Isabel who?* *Isabel working?* I had to knock.

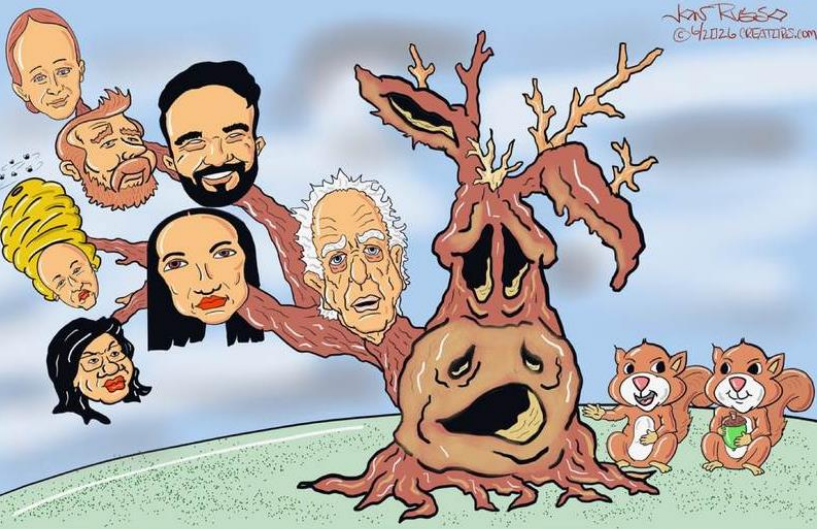

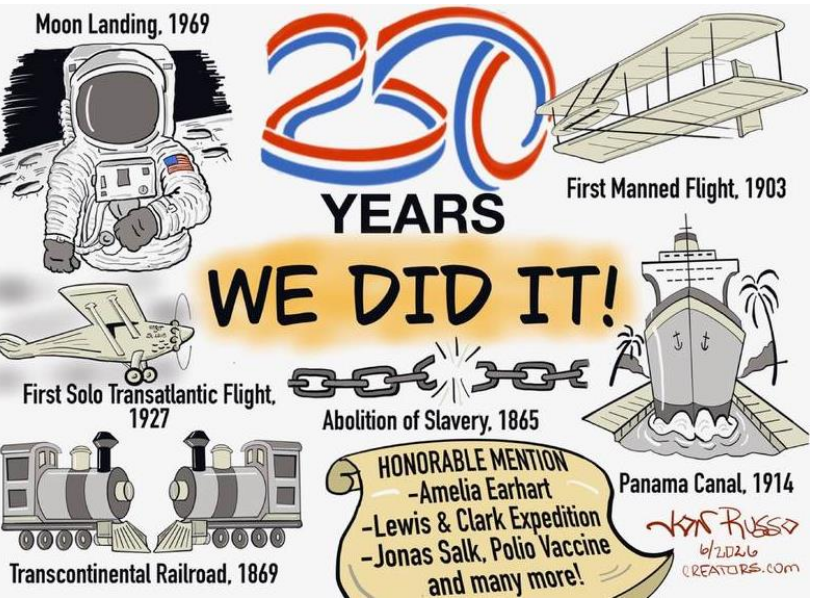

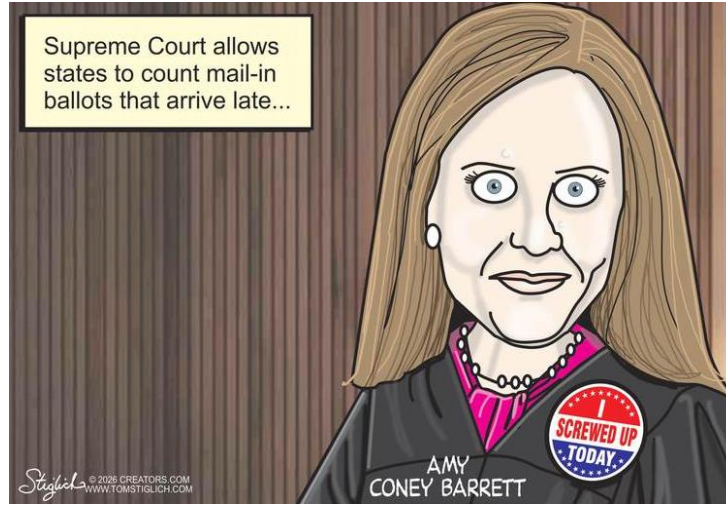
