Psalms 90:17

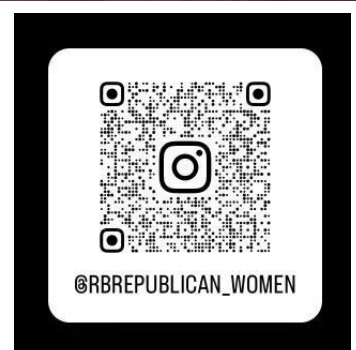

Your ways and means committee is happy to present Rhode Island or "Little Rhody" as our highlighted colony for the month of September. As one of the original 13 American colonies, Rhode Island was founded in 1636 by Roger Williams, a religious dissenter who had been banished from the Massachusetts Bay Colony. He established Providence as a settlement based on religious freedom and separation of church and state. A few years later, Anne Hutchinson and her followers also settled in the area, helping form other towns such as Portsmouth and Newport. These settlements eventually joined together. In 1663, Rhode Island received a royal charter from King Charles II, officially recognizing the colony as Rhode Island and Providence Plantations. This charter was important because it gave the colony unusual freedom to govern itself and protected religious liberty. During the colonial period, Rhode Island became known for:

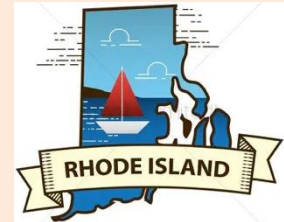
Religious tolerance

Self-government
Fishing and maritime activities

Trade and shipping

Its ports, especially Newport, became important centers for commerce. Like other New England colonies, Rhode Island also had an economy connected to the Atlantic trade network. Rhode Island played a role in the American Revolution and was the last of the original 13 states to ratify the U.S. Constitution in 1790. Today, Rhode Island's economy includes both manufacturing and service industries, along with specialized local products. Some important products and industries in Rhode Island today include:

- Jewelry and silverware, having long been known for fine jewelry making and metal products.
- Textiles and fabrics
- Textile production helped shape the state's industrial growth and remains a presence today in manufacturing.
- Because of its coastal location, Rhode Island is active in boat building, marine trades, and ocean-related technology.
- Food products include seafood namely, lobster, clams, oysters, calamari along with clam cakes, cornmeal, johnny cakes, tart green apples, and berry preserves, sea salt and frozen lemonade.
- Machinery and fabricated metal products
- Modern factories produce industrial parts, tools, and precision goods.
- Rubber and plastic products
- Health and technology products
- Companies involved in medical devices, research and technology services.



The state flower is a Violet and the anchor is its symbol with the seal of HOPE. Maybe we will share some Clam Chowder together at the next meeting.

California Crime Legislation

2014 – Prop 47, authored by then San Francisco (Newsom-appointed) District Attorney George Gascon, decriminalized thefts under \$950 per occurrence and drug use. Voters were probably duped by the title, “Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act”, and approved Prop 47 by 58%. Homelessness increased immediately and significantly: we now have 25% of the nation’s homeless. Reported crimes increased a little; however, since theft and vandalism were re-categorized as misdemeanors, they probably went under-reported.

2024 – A decade later, voters decided to address the deficiencies of Prop 47 with Prop 36. With a more accurate titling, “Homelessness, Drug Addiction, and Theft Reduction Act”, the citizens’ initiative passed by 68%. The initiative sought to reclassify repeat offenses as felonies. The problem is that the bill did not specify funding, and Newsom refused to fund it.

2026 – Sacramento recently introduced AB 2018 which would require mandatory restorative justice programs for non-violent crimes even for repeat offenders. Offenders who participated in the restorative justice program would get their convictions erased, thereby avoiding Prop 36 penalties for repeat offenders. AB 2018 passed the Assembly, but got a lot of bad press and was just recently placed in the “Suspense File.”

The Midterm Election

Ballot titling from Sacramento is so misleading that a voter must study each initiative before voting. A wonderful voter guide is Reform California’s [Plain English Voter Guide](https://www.reformcalifornia.org/voter-guides/california) available here: <https://www.reformcalifornia.org/voter-guides/california> Reform California will be sending a speaker, Trinity Hannaway, to our meeting in September. AB 2624 – The Nick Shirley Act

AB 2624 is a Mia Bonta sponsored bill that prevents investigations into social services fraud. Signed by Newsom and will most certainly be challenged in court.

by the Left. Prop 39 would be hard to challenge.

Vote-By-Mail (Absentee Voting):

- Both the SAVE Act and Prop 39 will continue vote-by-mail.
- The SAVE Act requires that voters request an absentee ballot.
- Prop 39 contains no language regarding absentee voting, meaning that universal vote-by-mail will still be practiced.

Proof of Citizenship to Register:

- The SAVE Act requires that individual citizens prove citizenship when they register. (Voters who are currently registered would not have to prove citizenship until they re-register when they move or change political parties.) In order to prove citizenship, a voter would need a birth certificate and if there is a surname change, a marriage certificate. Alternatively, a passport would work.
- Prop 39 does not require citizens to prove citizenship in order to register. That onus is on the Secretary of State. The SOS would cross-check the VoteCal voter roll against federal and state databases to verify citizenship.
- *Note:* In California, verification of citizenship is currently an honor system. According to California Elections Code Section 2111, “A person may prove he or she is a citizen by his or her certification under penalty of perjury on the affidavit of registration.”

ID to Cast a Ballot:

- The SAVE Act requires vote-by-mail voters to include a copy of a government-issued photo ID to vote-by-mail. A voter would bring their photo ID to the polls to vote in person.
- Prop 39 requires vote-by-mail voters to write the last 4 digits of a government-issued photo ID on the ballot envelope (probably inside). A voter would bring their photo ID to the polls to vote in person. Prop 39 states that the State must provide a free ID if a voter requests one.

Legal Precedent:

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled on voter ID for elections. In the 2008 (State of Indiana) Crawford Vs. Marion Elections Board Case, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that the State's interest in maintaining election security warranted the minor inconvenience of voters securing photo ID's. However, the Court noted that photo ID's are free in the State of Indiana. This case did not involve proof of citizenship.

Voter ID Statistics According to Grok:

Photo ID: About 1% of adult citizens lack any form of government-issued photo ID. However, for approximately 15% of adult citizens, that ID has either expired or has not been updated with their current address

Birth Certificates: about 2% of U.S. citizen adults do not have a copy of their birth certificate in their possession.

Challenges from the Left:

The Poll Tax Argument. There is an argument that since ID costs money, it constitutes a poll tax. Prop 39 contains a provision for free ID. The SAVE Act currently does not.

The Logistics to Secure ID Argument. Murkowski and others have made the argument that obtaining ID is difficult for people who live remotely, are elderly, invalid, or too busy working or caring for others.

Americanism or Progressivism: Which Will It Be?

Earlier this year, Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas delivered a speech in which he warned of an existential threat to the revolutionary principles that animated the birth of our republic. Those principles, written in the Declaration of Independence and embodied in the Constitution, state that all men are created equal, that rights are inherent in the individual and not something bestowed by government, and that the primary purpose of government is to uphold those rights impartially.

Unfortunately, sometime in the second century of our country, millions of Americans underwent a profound, seismic attitude shift. Seduced by an ideology and political movement that became known as progressivism, Americans embraced a vision of government that is fundamentally incompatible with the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and ultimately our freedom and way of life. Thomas explained how progressives favor rule by experts – government-led social engineering – and believe that those experts are so much wiser and more enlightened than the masses of citizens that their brilliant plans should not be thwarted by outdated beliefs about individual rights.

The philosophy of progressivism has a spirit of “meliorism” – the doctrine that one of the purposes of government is to improve the economic well-being of citizens by giving them financial assistance. The Founding Fathers were not meliorists. James Madison, a principal architect of the Constitution and our fourth president, declared, “Charity is no part of the legislative duty of the government.” The founders weren’t opposed to charity, but they believed that charity belongs properly to the private sector.

Why should the Government not support – i.e. give money to – anyone? This answers why progressivism is essentially incompatible with our declaration and Constitution. It’s because the government has no wealth of its own; it can spend only what it first takes from people in the private sector. Thus, any government welfare program is a wealth-redistribution program: Government takes from A and B to give to C and D. Instead of government protecting and upholding the property rights of all citizens impartially, political office-holders decide that certain citizens have a right to a portion of their fellow citizens’ property – that C’s and D’s rights are superior to A’s and B’s.

Thomas explained it in his stirring speech, “Progressivism seeks to replace the basic premises of the Declaration of Independence, and

hence our form of government. It holds that our rights and our dignities come not from God, but from the Government.”

Progressivism is the antithesis of Americanism. By asserting that individual property rights are not inalienable, but that a governing majority may apportion property as it sees fit, progressives opened the floodgates to all sorts of economic, social, and political chaos, which are retrogressive.

The progressive redistribution of wealth has snowballed over the decades so that today the U.S. Treasury is nearly \$40 trillion in debt – several times that amount if you factor in the unfunded liabilities of federal entitlement programs. Our society is fractured with a perverse class warfare in which progressive demagogues denigrate and persecute the wealthy who are the engines of economic progress, the benefactors who increasingly enrich society, while progressives push for larger diminutions of individual property rights and ever more government control over the property of its citizens.

Which will prevail? The American vision of equality before the law, or the progressive vision of government exerting increasing power over property and wealth? Thomas made no predictions in his speech, but he expressed that Americanism and progressivism cannot coexist indefinitely, for they are fundamentally incompatible. He called for a rebirth of dedication to our country’s noble ideals, and he encouraged us to be courageous.

As we celebrate our country’s 250th birthday, we need to rededicate ourselves to the Founders’ vision. Otherwise, the contest between progressivism and Americanism will be won by the progressives, who will leave us with a bankrupt, ruined economy, a great diminution of rights, and the loss of the greatest system of government in humankind’s long history.
